OUR LADY OF GUADALUPE PILGRIMAGE ITINERARY

DAY 1: DEPARTURE, ZÓCALO, CATHEDRAL

Depart Chicago O'Hare Airport on flight to Mexico City in the morning between 6 – 9 a.m. The flight will depart in U.S. Central Time and be direct to Mexico City. Upon arrival, travel by private coach bus to the 4 star hotel in the center of Mexico City to leave our baggage. Our pilgrimage begins with a guided walking tour of the zócalo, Mexico City's enormous town square and beating heart. Mexico's National Palace fronts the square. We'll then tour the immense colonial Cathedral and its adjacent baptistery, which face the zócalo. These sacred interiors drip with churrigueresque gold and are filled with genuine liturgical art from the colonial period. (Look for the plaque to Bishop Juan de Zumárraga in the Cathedral. He was the first to see the tilma of St. Juan Diego.) After the Cathedral, our guide will lead us through the fascinating Museo del Templo Mayor, built over the remains of a massive Aztec temple, which is stuffed with pre-Colombian Mexican artifacts. This zone was the administrative core of Tenochtitlan, the New World's greatest city. It is near here that Moctezuma, the Aztec's great leader, was killed. Dinner near the hotel.

DAY 2: SHRINE OF GUADALUPE, ANTHROLPOLOGY MUSEUM

After breakfast at the hotel, the group will travel by bus to the Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe, (known locally as "La Villa") the most visited Marian shrine in the world. The group will have Mass at the shrine, pray the rosary, and have a guided tour of the extensive grounds, including the colonial-era Basilica. There will be time for shopping in the many religious stores. La Villa is the spiritual home of the Mexican nation. It is many things – a place of communal prayer, history, national identity, and personal encounter with the Virgin Mary and her son Jesus. In the afternoon the group will travel by bus for a guided tour of the Castle in Chapultepec Park and then visit one of the world's greatest museums, El Museo Nacional de Antropología. This is the most visited museum in all of Mexico. Here we'll take a deep dive into old Mexico and its artefacts, from the Aztec Sun Dial to huge Olmec stone heads. There is no need to visit every archeological site in Mexico – the sites come to you here, all under one roof. In the evening return by bus to the hotel for a peaceful evening and dinner nearby.

DAY 3: COYOACAN; CARMELITE MONASTERY

Breakfast at the hotel. Take the bus to Coyoacán, one of Mexico City's oldest neighborhoods. We'll take a pleasant tour of its charming, narrow, tree-lined streets. The neighborhood hides two plazas, the colonial church of San Juan Bautista, numerous cantinas, some small museums, and various markets and artistic shops. After lunch in the center of Coyoacán, the group will tour a 17th century Carmelite monastery which is now a museum. In the evening we'll say "Adios" to Mexico City and travel by private bus to Puebla, about 2 hours away. Dinner in Puebla and a restful night in a 5-star hotel.

DAY 4: PUEBLA

Breakfast at the hotel. Today the group enjoys touring Puebla, a lovely city with a vast colonial core. Mass will be held at Puebla's enormous Cathedral, one of the first built in New Spain. The group will enjoy lunch near Puebla's handsome zocalo, and then pray at the gilded chapel of the rosary, a liturgical jewel box. The group will visit the nearby Palafox Library, have time for shopping, and visit the museum Amparo and the beautiful views of Puebla from its rooftop café. Dinner in Puebla.

DAY 5: TLAXCALA; VIRGIN OF OCOTLAN & DEPARTURE

Breakfast at the hotel. In the late morning take the bus to Tlaxcala, about 45 minutes north of Puebla, for a mini-pilgrimage to the shrine of Our Lady of Ocotlan. The Virgin here has been venerated for almost as long as the Virgin of Guadalupe. Mass in the stunning shrine. Lunch in Tlaxcala. We'll then tour Tlaxcala's iconic bull ring, with its charming bell tower, and the nearby Cathedral as well as see the vibrant murals in the city's town hall. In the afternoon head to Mexico City for the return flight in the late afternoon or early evening.

Our Lady of Guadalupe Pilgrimage 2025 Questions and Answers

What does the cost include? Round trip economy flight Chicago – Mexico City, all airline taxes and fuel surcharges, transfer to and from airport to hotel, bus throughout tour, clean, private bath, 4 or 5 star hotel room; all museum entrance fees; audio headsets throughout tour; all professional guides; all meals, one checked bag for each hotel room.

What does the cost *not* include? Taxis, tips for your guides, and the carrying of luggage from the airport baggage claim area to the bus, and to and from the bus to the hotel. We recommend bringing about \$50 for taxis and always sharing taxi rides.

What is the cancellation policy? All cancellations must be made by e-mail by the same person(s) who registered for the trip. The following penalties are applicable if you cancel:

From date of reservation until **September 1, 2024,** \$500 is non-refundable, but transferable to a person replacing the person cancelling, for the same tour and dates.

As of **November 1, 2024** 100% of the tour price is non-refundable and non-transferable.

Is there a registration form? There is no registration form. Peregrino tries to make registration as easy as possible. To register for the pilgrimage send an e-mail to travel@myperegrinotour.com with the name, address, phone, and e-mail for each pilgrim who would like to go. Please indicate the parents or legal guardians of minor travelers. You will be officially notified of your registration via e-mail the day your check is deposited or your credit card payment clears. After sending your check, please allow one week for us to confirm your registration via e-mail.

Do I need a passport? Yes. If you are a U.S. citizen, you will need a passport to travel to Mexico. Passports are required for everyone, even children and infants. The expiration date of the passport must be beyond six months after the date of re-entry into the U.S. A scan of the ID page of your passport must be received by e-mail at travel@myperegrinotour.com or a copy can be sent to our PO Box prior to the final payment deadline. The copy of the passport and its information will be shared with no one. All documentary or digital traces of the copy of the passport will be destroyed at the conclusion of the tour.

Do I need to obtain a visa? U.S. citizens do not need a visa to enter Mexico for a short trip. Non-U.S. citizens must verify with the Mexican consulate if they need a visa to enter Mexico. Mexican citizens living in the U.S. must verify their ability to enter Mexico and to re-enter the U.S. Peregrino Tours cannot assist a pilgrim to verify their travel status.

Is there any chance the trip would be cancelled? In the remote possibility that the trip is cancelled, the entire cost of the trip will be reimbursed. An extraordinary event such as an airline strike, weather event, act of God, or international incident will not necessarily cause the trip to be cancelled. Trip insurance would provide total protection against such unlikely eventualities.

I'd like to go, but I don't have a roommate to share the cost. What can I do? You can either pay the single occupancy supplement or be willing to be assigned a roommate if one is available. That will depend, of course, on the number of solo travelers of the same sex, but Peregrino will keep track of who needs roommates and coordinate as needed. If a roommate is available but is refused, the traveler will be required to pay the single supplement. And if there is an odd number of pilgrims and no roommate can be found for a single traveler, the single supplement must be paid, with the latest registrant being obligated to purchase a single room. If non-spouses or non-family members would like to share a room with another pilgrim, they must each communicate such to Peregrino in an email.

Can I reserve a place even though I have not paid in full? You can reserve your place by making a deposit of \$500, or by paying the full amount, upon registration.

What about travel insurance? Peregrino Tours does not offer travel insurance. But for the protection of our pilgrims, we recommend they purchase travel insurance. Information is readily available online and some recommendations are linked on our website. These recommendations are not an endorsement of any company but only the result of prior traveler's experiences.

Why would I want travel insurance? Insurance is a good idea for those who have an unpredictable medical condition and for those who have a family member whose ill health, or even death, may preclude going on the pilgrimage. Travel insurance must

normally be purchased shortly after registering for the trip. It normally cannot be purchased close to the date of departure, or it may be priced exorbitantly.

Can I use airline miles or points? Peregrino prefers that all pilgrims fly together both to and from their destination and arrive at, and leave from, their hotel together. Based on experience, we allow pilgrims to register for the pilgrimage if they travel apart from the group only after the early bird deadline has passed, if space is available. Contact Peregrino for a ground only price.

Can I upgrade my plane seating or otherwise arrange to sit with family and friends? Peregrino Tours organizes its tour pricing based on economy seating. We can try to arrange economy plus, business class, first class, aisle seats, or other upgrades on a particular basis. Payment for such upgrades must be made in advance of their confirmation. We will try to accommodate friends and family who request to sit together on flights. But plane seating is ultimately a decision for each airline and airlines are not always transparent about how seating is apportioned.

What about travelers with special needs? Any pilgrim with special needs or dietary restrictions must inform Peregrino at the time of registration. There will be considerable walking on the tour so being able to stand for long periods and to walk long distances is presumed upon registering. A physically capable companion must accompany travelers who need assistance. Coach buses are not equipped with ramps, so all travelers must be able to mount steps into a bus. Many buildings in Mexico are also less handicap accessible than American buildings. Taking the occasional taxi can greatly alleviate a day's number of steps.

Can anyone go on the trip? Although this will be a Catholic focused pilgrimage, non-Catholics are welcome to come. Minors are welcome provided they travel with family. In order to ensure a rewarding, positive, and faith filled experience for all pilgrims, Peregrino reserves the right to reject any guest, either before or during the trip, whose comportment contradicts or is otherwise harmful to the interests of the group.
